Bewildering Surprise Given the Wheat Trade in the Exports.

THAT CEREAL OPENED AT A DECLINE

Demand for Carloads of Corn in the Cash Market Was Active, Exports Continued to Compete with the Shippers for the Offerings.

Chicago, Sept. 21.—A bewildering surprise was given the wheat trade in the exports. The whole crop practically sold out at the theory that the harvest was not so good as an hour later the wheat and flour for the day reached nearly 700,000 bu. The market recovered from a loss of 5c, and closed only 1/2c lower than it did yesterday.

Corn and oats were very strong, more especially the latter, which closed at a gain of 1/2c. Corn advanced about 1/2c. Provisions were weak.

Wheat at the opening was weaker and prices fell, followed by a further decline of 1/2c. The market for the day was stronger, and prices were advanced from 1/2c to 1c, and closed at 1 1/2c.

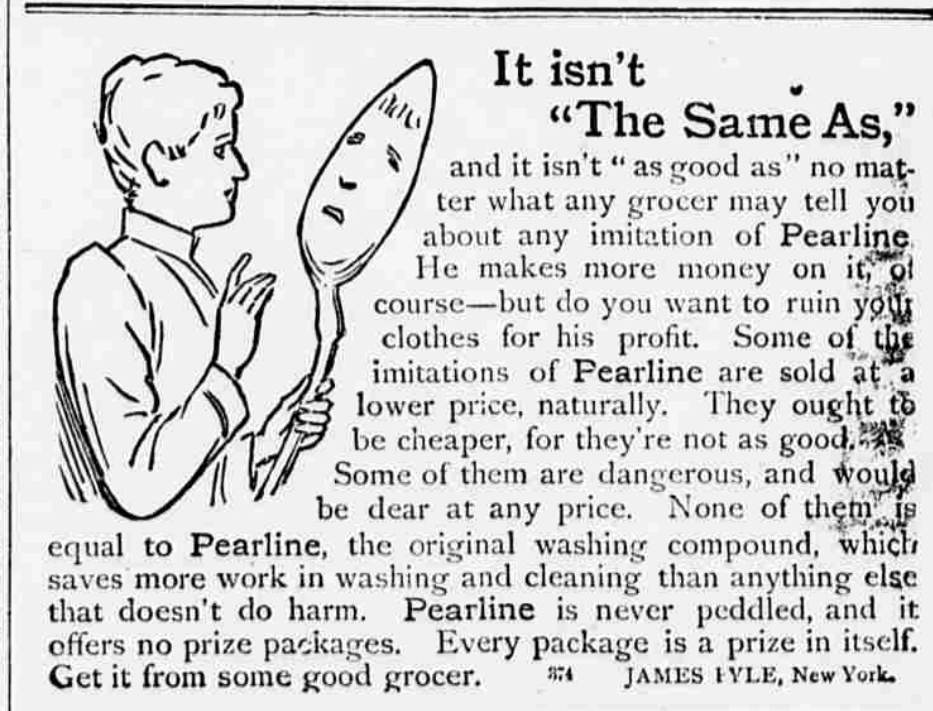
