RECOVERED STEALY GENT.

Story of the Finding of the Money Stolen from the Bureau of the Missouri State Penitentiary. CALUMET, Mich., Oct. 2.—The true story of the recovery of the entire \$70,000 stolen from the Missouri State Penitentiary is now known. It will be remembered that Shoups and Winters, two railway employes at Marquette, were arrested and subsequently released. They stole the money from the Missouri State Penitentiary, and Sheriff Dunn claims to have struck the lead and imparted his plan of work to Deputy Sheriff Foley, who, he claims, took advantage of his superior position as press officer, secured the reward for himself, divided it with the prisoners and obtained the confession of the guilty employes. Foley's commission as deputy and to a reporter told the story. Heretofore the officers have maintained that the money had not been recovered, although the officers of the company claimed that it had.

Three Fatally Shot.

OAKLAND, Cal., Oct. 2.—A desperate shooting affray occurred here last night in which three men were fatally wounded and a fourth seriously hurt. A crowd of citizens joined the police in the chase of a would-be murderer, sending after him a fusillade of shots in the crowded streets. William Green and Tom Mullen were standing out on a saloon at the corner of Seventh street and Broadway, when they were shot by a man whose name was unknown. Butts, an acquaintance of Green's, passed. Green accosted Butts by asking him he got out of the saloon. Butts drew a revolver and shot Green, who fell to the curb. Policeman Seaman then attempted to arrest Butts, who, seeing the other party shot, fired at Seaman, fatally wounding him. Another look-out in the body of a man whose name was unknown. Butts, a serious wound. Other policemen and a crowd of citizens started in pursuit of Butts. Many in the crowd had revolvers, and over twenty shots were sent after the fleeing fugitive. When he was finally captured, it was found five bullets had entered his body. Green, Seaman and Butts cannot live.

Scrimmage Between Policemen.

New York, Oct. 2.—Policeman J. S. Ball of the East Fourth Street station was shot and seriously wounded in the dormitory of that building this morning. The weapon was fired during a scrimmage between Policemen Storms and Broderick of the same precinct. According to the dispatch sent to police headquarters, Ball, who was on the reserve force, amused himself by poking fun at Storms. Broderick resented this and reached for his pistol. The shot was close by. A tussle between the patrolmen ensued, during which the weapon was discharged. The bullet entered Ball's left breast. Broderick was shortly arrested and was sent to Bellevue hospital. It was discovered that the bullet had penetrated the lung and that the injury is likely to prove fatal.

Investigating the Burson Family.

ALEXANDRIA, Va., Oct. 2.—There were two strangers here during the last week representing themselves as newspaper men. They are thought to be connected with the Burson family, of whom they inquired very closely. They visited the Burson home, which is a spacious old-style brick mansion, two stories high, with a broad hall running through the center, and surrounded by a half square of large shade trees and shrubbery, all enclosed by a high brick wall. They took a good look at the residence and its surroundings. They talked with a number of persons in the vicinity and referred to the affair in Chicago, remarking that they were acquainted with Banker Gargan and that he would not hesitate to spend \$10,000 in defending himself against the charges preferred against him by Mrs. Anna Burson.

Two Inmate in Mexico.

CITY OF MEXICO, Oct. 2.—Francisco Garcia, editor of the Siglo, and Rodriguez Pena, editor of the Don Quixote, fought a duel Sunday with swords. The latter was so obviously at the mercy of the former that the doctors present abruptly quitted the fight after five minutes had taken place, saying that the duel was a mere farce. The duel was thereupon suspended.

Settled the Feud.

MARSHALL, Ill., Oct. 2.—At Thompson, Washaw township, southeast of this city, John O'Harrow and Don Thompson, who had not been on friendly terms for some time, met last evening and without warning shot the latter in the chest. The steel bullet turned to run he was again shot in the back. Thompson then fired three more shots at his enemy. The layers of the bullet entered the Washaw bottom. O'Harrow's wounds are fatal. It is feared that Thompson and his relatives will make a determined resistance to the fugitive's arrest and that they expect. Armed parties are scouring the woods after Thompson.

Think He Was Murdered.

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 2.—Patrolman Bacon made a ghastly find about 2 o'clock this morning in an alley back of a saloon at 33 East Market street. It was the body of a man about 35 years old, who had evidently been murdered after midnight. The steel bullet was crushed and the face was covered with blood. The police think the weapon was a sandbag. The dead man is said to be unidentified. On the body was found a receipt issued by the Germania lodge, A. O. U. W., of host-ian Beer, and on a fly leaf of a book was printed the name of Taylor Owens. The man was well dressed in a light suit. The body was removed to the morgue.
