SOME INCIDENTS IN A SENATOR'S YOUTH How He Daily Expected to Be Killed—One Way of Avoiding It—How He Got His Partner's Iron Shoe—Details of a Fight.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—[Staff Correspondence of THE BEE.]—William Morris Stewart of Nevada, who has spoken longer and more frequently than any other man in the Senate, is regaling his colleagues with silver-veiled bits of his life in the Senate restaurant.
