Wheat Opened with a Better Feeling Yesterday and Was Firm.

FIRST REPORTS SHOWED LIGHT RECEIPTS. Later it Was Evident that a Mistake Had Been Made, but the Trade Was Some Time in Comprehending the Situation.

Chicago, Nov. 21.—Wheat was firm and higher today. December closed 5/8c above yesterday's last prices on better cables, better inquiry for export grain and covering by shorts. Corn was firm and closed 3/8c higher. Provisions were irregular, but for the most part weak, and closed lower by 1/2c on pork and from 2/8c to 3/8c lower on lard and tallow.

Wheat opened with a better feeling, December starting at 60 3/8c above yesterday's closing. The first reports showed light receipts in the northwest and the price advanced. Later a correction was received from Danuth stating that receipts were 785 cars instead of 240, as first reported, but the correction was received with so much immediate further slight gains. It was imagined that some one at Duluth, with interest in depressing prices, was working the report of receipts there with that end in view. A dispatch apparently emanating from Duluth indicated that the first report had been read as 785 cars and not 240 cars. Reports of cars on track will be discontinued; reports of inspection will be furnished only. The export clearance was being causing a temporary reaction, but the rains now prevailing here and through the west and northwest led to expectation of lighter receipts and the price continued to advance. Considerable short covering was said to have been covered for the northwest by Arthur Orr and with the firm closing of cables local shorts succumbed to the day and coverers followed. December climbed 1/4c after the opening, gained 3/8c, sold 3/4c higher and lost 3/8c at 10:30, when the market went weather caused a more bullish feeling in the corn pit and the firmness in wheat had its influence.

With moderate receipts, light estimates for tomorrow and in sympathy with corn, oats scored a gain. Provisions opened lower, but with a somewhat brisk trade early advanced slightly.
