Feature of the Grain Market Yesterday Was Extreme Dullness

WHEAT FLUCTUATED AND CLOSED LOWER

Some Buying Caused by an Advance in the Cash Article at Minneapolis Sent Prices Up to Yesterday's Quotations.

CHICAGO, Jan. 31.—The feature of the grain market today was the extreme dullness and the narrow range of prices. Wheat closed 1/4c lower after fluctuating within a 1/2c range. May corn and May oats were unchanged and provisions slightly higher all around.

Wheat began the day with a tired feeling and a decline of 1/4c from yesterday's closing price for May at 63 1/2c. Cables were low and private telegrams were discouraging. There was a rumor that the Austrian government was contemplating increasing the duty on flour to seven francs, and this was being offered freely. But with all the bearish news the market held up steadily.

There was a fairly good trade in oats. There was moderate selling by longs, but closed to materially affect prices. May opened at 52 1/2c, advanced 1/4c and closed at 53 1/2c.
