Italy. A baker there makes \$4 per week, a tailor \$4.59, a painter \$5. Housemalds in England receive an average of 3 shillings a week as wages, to-gether with their food and lodgings.

At Bellaire 7,000 coal miners of the sixth sub-district reached an agreement which

will allow them to go to work at once.

The wages of seamen in sailing vessels are about the same all over the world, averaging 60 shillings a month, with food; seamen employed on the steamers receiving about 10 per cent more. In 1835 the rate of wages in Europe was very low. Day laborers in Italy received 8 cents per day; in Russia, 12 cents; in Holland, 18 cents; in France, 30 cents; in

England, 40 cents; in the United States, It is quite possible that the machinists will strike the word "white" from their constitution and admit negroes. The most progressive men are advocating the reform, and if it carries this large organization will join the American Federation of Labor. A French mill hand has, before going to work, a piece of bread and 2 cents worth of brandy; at breakfast, bread crumbled into

a bowl of coffee; for dinner, a piece of bread and cheese or an apple, or a gill of red wine;

for supper, a piece of bread and sausage, or, oftener, a herring and a cup of coffee. The resignation of Superintendent Fennell of the northern division of the Lehigh Valley railroad is attributed to his dissatisation with the appointment of Superintendent Esser, formerly of the Wyoming division, as his assistant. During the re-cent strike the higher officials expressed more or less dissatisfaction with Superin-tendent Esser's methods, and after the strike was declared off he was displaced by the ap-pointment of Alexander Mitchell, the former superintendent of motive power, to his posi-tion. CONDITION OF OMAHA'S TRADE

Cold Snap Acted but Slightly as a Restriction on Local Business.

COUNTRY BUYERS STILL COME TO TOWN

More Attention is Paid to Fancy Lines Than Heretofore-Notions Keeping Pace with Staples - Ant cipating Summer Sales -The Bank Clearings.

Although the cold snap of the latter part of the week has no doubt had a tendency to restrict some lines of trade, its effects have scarcely been noticeable. The local jobbers have enjoyed another week of active business in all lines, and in many respects the week has been an improvement on all previous records this season. The trade continues to branch cut more freely along general lines and unless some decided set back is experienced the volume of March business in several lines will foot up to fully average proportions. The attendance of country buyers, which has been the feature of the folding trade during the month, has not diminished and is a tremendous benefit to ocal trade. There is a growing tendency on the part of buyers to pay more attention to fancy lines instead of merely ordering their stocks of staples, as they have been largely doing heretofore. Trade in hoslery, underwear and furnishing goods, which has been very light all the spring, is becoming more ctive and a fair aggregate of orders for

these lines are recorded.
Some of this freedom may no doubt be Some of this freedom may no do due to the fact that the season is so far advanced that these stocks must be filled up if at all. Some of the retailers who ordered if at all. Some of the retailers who ordered the bulk of their requirements early in the mouth, leaving the fancy lines to be filled out later, have decided to make their stocks complete, and have added small bills of hosiery and notions to their original orders.
Some of the local dry goods houses have shown bargains in summer dress goods during the week, in which they have done a heavy business. The low prices at which certain lines of goods have been selling con-tinue, although any material gain in business at other points is liable to precipitate an advance at any time.

The market is firmer all around on gro-cers' staples, although prices are not yet quoted perceptibly higher. If business keeps up, however, there is but little doubt that there will be a sharp advance on various lines that are now selling below the cost of putting on the market. It is generally re-ported that retail trade outside of the city s showing decided improvement, and this belief is encouraged by a steady gain in col-lections. Canned goods are showing improvement and other lines of fancy groceries are coming into better demand.

In hardware, boots and shoes and other lines trade is steady, with some perceptible gain every week. Traveling men report that they do not experience nearly as much diffculty in selling goods as a month ago and that, the retailers generally are feeling better every day. That Omaha is rapidly distancing all com-petitors as a desirable jobbing market is

becoming more evident every day. One day last week a prominent retail merchant of this state stopped off in Omaha for a day or two on his way home from St. Joseph, where he had purchased his spring stock of dry goods. His curiosity led him into one of the Omaha establishments, where he found he could have bought his goods a considerable per cent cheaper than what he had paid in St. Joseph, and have a fresher and a together more attractive stock from which to make his selections. The result was that he wired the St. Joseph house canceling his order, and

from now on will be a regular patron of the Omaha jobbers. The bank clearings show some falling off on the last three days of the week, which makes the total slightly less than those of

Trade of the Week Fickle and Fluctuating-Politics and Business. Mr. W. H. Roberson, Omaha manager of the mercantile agency of R. G. Dun & Co., speaking of trade in Omaha, says:

"Trade this week in general has been a good deal like the weather, fickle and fluctuating. Groceries, hardware and dry goods report an excellent trade, furniture not so good, boots and shoes fair for a part of the week and good the remaining portion of the week. Creckery, liquors, leather and drugs nothing to boast of. Commission houses have had a precarious week of it owing to the extreme changes of the weather. The country at large appears to have fallen back a little and a degree of uncertainty as to the future is again noted at most financial centers. Omaha included among the rest. The impression is gaining ground that the latest proposed tariff legislation will be enacted and this has had an effect upon stocks and business generally not to the advantage of trade. It is conceded that when the bill is enacted, whether in its present shape or with modifications, if it is enacted, that the country will immediately adjust itself to the conditions which it is thought the bill will bring about. One thing or the other is what the commercial world is pray-ing for, but as it is not likely that the legislation will be completed before July 1, the feeling among business men is general that no sharp turn toward recovery

may be expected until that time, "Politics have too much to do with business "Polities have too much to do with business in this country. Every four years a presidential election paralyzes trade and the conditions are such that, unfortunate as it may be, everybody is more or less affected by the legislation of the national government. As the proposed new law will not go into effect immediately after it is passed it is quite probable that the recovery for which we all hope the recovery for which we all hope may be delayed until late in the fall. Nevertheless, locally the state and the city are in good shape. The blizzard of this week was a surprise and will cause some lesses to cattlemen and probably damage fruit in certain localities of the state, but the heavy fall of snow in the semi-arid section will probably assure us a good crop of spring wheat, and will leave the ground in excellent condition for spring work of all kinds. Retail business in the city shows some improvement as the spring advances. On the warm days of the present week shopping has been quite active and the working people who have been in enforced idleness during the severe weather have been able to earn wages and spent it.
"The notable event of the week was the
