INDIFFERENCE IN THE CATTLE TRADE. Top Grades Dull to Lower with Unders Almost Steady—Hogs Sell Off Five to Fifteen Cents Under Persistent Finding.

TUESDAY, April 24. There was a good average Tuesday's run of stock, but supplies for the two days compared with the first two days of last week show a decrease of 3,500 cattle, 700 hogs and 400 sheep.

Cattle receipts were scarcely half as heavy as on last Tuesday, but last Tuesday's receipts were exceptionally heavy. The quality of the offerings today was very fair, and buyers had little cause for complaint on that score. Trade was far from satisfactory.
