Chicago Operators Caught Short in Oats and Nicely Squeezed Yesterday.

VERY NEAT CORNER EFFECTUALLY WORKED

Hess Controls the Market and Puts the Price at His Own Figure—Wheat Gains a Quarter for the Day—Corn Falls.

CHICAGO, April 25.—Shorts in the oats market today on the Board of Trade realized that they were cornered for that delivery.

Wheat closed 1/2 higher for May, and 1/4 lower for July. Soon after the opening May wheat advanced 1/4 to 1/2 on the report that the chief manipulator stood in the middle of the crowd nearly all the time, bidding May up to 23 1/2.

The corn market was firm, but not very active, and its strength appeared to come largely from sympathy with the wheat market.

Receipts of All Sorts: Light for the Day and for the Week.

BEUF CATTLE SELL SOME BETTER

From Five to Ten Cents Secured on an Even Advance—Cows Go Steady—Hog Sellers Have the Best of the Day.

Supplies of all kinds were comparatively light today, and so far this week, compared with last, receipts show a decrease of 4,000 cattle, 3,400 hogs and 1,900 sheep.

There were only 79 cars of cattle all told received today and the quality was fair and that's about all.

The demand was better than usual, as favorable season advanced shippers and exporters, while the smallness of the supply caused some anxiety on the part of buyers for local houses.

Prices were a trifle uneven, but on an average 5 to 10c better than Tuesday, and the good light steers showing the most and the rough heavy cattle the least improvement.

The movement was free throughout and by noon there was little bid odds and odds remaining unsold.

Cow stock constituted but an insignificant proportion of the offerings today and there was no quotable change in prices.

There is an active demand for good fat cows and heifers, but the common and canning grades are in rather inferior demand.

Calves have been coming in rather too freely for the good of the market and prices today ruled 25c lower than the close of last week.

The market for rough stock of all kinds was just about steady.

There was more life and a better tone to the stocker and feeder trade today.

Prices ruled stronger, but hardly quotable higher. Both regular dealers and outsiders were good.

The supply was pretty well cleaned up at the close. Good to choice feeders are quoted at \$3.10 to \$3.75.
