

PARIS, April 27 .- The trial of Emile Heart, the anarchist who on February 12 threw a bomb into the cafe beneath the Terminus station, was begun today in the assizea court of the department of the Seine.

The court room was crowded, and among the spectators were soveral women. The greatest precautions were taken by the police in order to prevent a bomb outrage, the outside of the Palace of Justice and the corritors of that building being crowded with people and police. In the list of jurors there is no prominent name. The prosecution will call fifty witnesses, but the number retained by the defense is only eleven.

Maitre Hornbostel, Henri's defender, has been endeavoring to obtain a three-days release from the prison of Ciairvaux of Henri's brother, whom he intends to call as a witness to prove Henri's insanity, the line of defense which he intends to adopt. Henri himself is absolutely opposed to this plan being raised and, consequently, against bis counsels and consequently, against his counsels advice and his mother's en-treaties, he prepared a long defense of his acts, which he will read to the court. His attitude in prison was composed. He en-joyed his meals, slept well and chatted with Joyed his meals, slept well and chatterd with his keepers and, if anything, showed an-toyance at the thought that the matter has dragged so long. The bomb had been wrapped in a copy of Le Temps, in which was an article relating to the ar-rist of two anarchists, Emil Henri and his brother, Fortune. Investigation showed the latter was in Brubbols on November 8, when the bomb explosion occurred, and therefore suspicion naturally fastened it-self on Emil Henri, who disappeared im-mediately afterwards and who sought refuge in England. December 30, 1892, Henri hired a room in the Villa Faucez, Rue des Envirges, under the name of Louid Dubols. There he procured the necessary chemicals to manufacture an explosive hemb and also purchased a small saucepan as found in the offices of the Carmany

Not finding these places as full of weathy looking people as ha expected he went to the Cafe de la Paix, but even that establishment was not full enough of his prospective victims, and so he continued on his way until he arrived at he Cafe Terminus, situated beneath the

Commissioners Pleased with Ronds They Saw in Missouri.

The members of the Board of County Comnissioners, who went to Missouri for the urpose of investigating macadam, returned hursday, after having visited Kausas City, loplin and some of the smaller towns, where lifferent kinds of pay ment have been used. All of the commissioners who went out on the little junket are loud in the oraise of what they saw, and especially so

of macadam. In speaking of paving Commissioner Jen-kins said that in Jopin nearly all of the business streets were paved with macadam and that a number of the roads leading inte the county were paved with the same ma-terial, and in all cases it had given the best of satisfaction. On streets that were paved with brick at the same time when maca was put down, the latter material n much better condition and was showing ess effects from wear.

Upon reaching Kansas City the commis-sioners hired a toam and drove over the en-tire paved portion of the city, securing data upon the subject of all kinds of material. In talking with officials Mr. Jenkins said that he was informed that macadam was considered superior to brick or asphalt for streats and roads where there was not a great amount of heavy traffic.
