# BATH TUB THAT IS A TERROR

Vagrants Who Will Be Panic Stricken at the Sight of It.

SOMETHING NEW AT THE CITY JAIL

Police Propose to Operate it Vigorously or a Number of Uncleanly Prisoners-Some of Those on the List

to Go in First.

At last a long felt want has been sup-

plied at the police station, and now prisoners

when arrested who are likely to be detained at the city Jail for any length of time will have to indulge in the luxury of a bath, but the word luxury may be improperly applied, and probably the term hardship or pain might be used with greater propriety.

Last work a real, genuine bath tub was ordered to be placed in the city jail for the exclusive use of prisoners. Often a man is arrested for being a vagrant, and while this... arrested for being a vagrant, and while this charge is only slight, yet a frequent repetition is the cause of his being detailed do work upon the streets or do chores in the barn, and his sentence may be for five, ten or sixty days. Take a prisoner, for instance, who "draws" sixty days, add the time previous to his arrest in which he has not irrigated any portion of his body, say, possibly, an occasional dabble to remove the mud from his eyes so he can see to walk, and when his sixty days expire he is well night resking with flith.

The bath tub which has been ordered and a about to be put in place is six feet long is about to be put in place is six feet long and about three deep, made of good material and has a drainage apparatus which is guaranteed to carry off any amount of real estate that might have accumulated in the pores of any man's skin, be he Boston Green, cld John Bollne or Jack Dafley, or the "mayor of Memphis," as he is better known. The tub will be placed in a room especially arranged for it, which will be ten feet long, six wide and eight high. This apartment will be "exclusive," one at a time and there will be no attendants specially for that purpose, but if necessary for ially for that purpose, but if necessary for the purpose of coercion an attendant or as many as may be necessary will be suplied, "Transients" will not be compelled to

bathe if their time does not exceed a week, but if they desire to wash no objection will There is a famous list and any one be-

longing to it whenever seen on the street, as a rule, is locked up for vagrancy, and as these fellows have been arrested times too frequent to mention, and their sentences are usually not less than ten, fifteen and sixty days, the first thing that will be re-quired of them is to bathe. Some names on the list may be of in-terest to those who have heard of them be-

fore. The list follows and also, a short biography of each and their tendency toward cleanliness:

Archie Rhodes, John Boline, or the "Si-Archie Rhodes, John Holine, or the Si-lent" Swede, John May, Wilson Hoye, Hugh Burns, Boston Green, Jack Daily, or "the Mayor of Memphis," and John Jay. It is not desired to arouse the slightest

lealousy on the part of any of these, but he merits of all have been taken into consideration and in silent conclave it has been lecided that Archie Rhodes, who heads the ist, has deserved that distinction by laborious efforts. It has been decided that he is the filthlest vagrant that has ever adorned a cell at the station. Whether in his youth Archie had ever been treated to a bath is not positively known, but it is a matter of record that he has not bathed for fifteen years, and the only time his body is ever exposed to fresh air is when the clothes he wears either fall off or somebody gives him a change. Archie was never known to work, not in Omain, at least, and he is as afraid of it as he is of water. Once he was sent to fail about the 15th of July, and it being warm, he was asked to wash his feet or keep his shoes on. He kept them on.
Once he was found in the rear of the Cozzens hotel eating from a refuse barrel, into which he had climbed and was standing knee deep. The refuse, of course, clung to his clothes, and he was a perfect haven of flies. Of course he was arrested, and as the prisoners could not stand it he was asked to wash. He looked troubled and finally said he did not like to. But he got a bath. Poor Archie was stood up in the corner, clothes and all, and the hose turned Since then Archie has never

heard from.

John Boline, next on the list, came nearly running a dead heat with Archie for first place. Now, John says his trouble dated from a time when he was a small boy. One bright summer afternoon he and his brother were out in a boat and the boat upset, throwing both into the water. This is in all likelihood the last time John has had a bath. His clothes fairly stick to him, and while the police are not troubled with him much in summer, every night during the cold season he appears and asks for a place cold season he appears and asks for a piace to sleep. John was never known to work, and lives by begging. Not long ago he went to the station and asked for lodging and saw the bath tub. He at once mentioned his intention of going west, as he thought he could better live there. John's hands and face are as black as a stove, and he has become bard of hearing from the he has become hard of hearing from the dirt that has accumulated in his ears. The bath tub is waiting for him.

John May, Wilson Hoye and Hugh Burns are three of Omaha's most celebrated vagrants. They form what is known as, and what has become, a familiar sight about the streets, "the bucket brigade." It cannot be said of them that they never work, but it can and with truth be said that they never wash. The "bucket brigade," and John May is captain of it, carns a liveli-hood and thrives by raking a yard every now and then or throwing in a ton of coal, Invariably they go about, each with a broom or shovel on his shoulder, and, as in order to constitute vagrancy there must be no visible means of support, they evade the police very often by carrying their im-plements with them. A program has been prepared for these three. The first time they are locked up together each will have to give the other a bath.

he once had of being a useful citizen. Wilson Hoye and Hugh Burns are about as fitthy a couple in appearance as one will often find, and every time they are jailed together the windows from all sides are opened in order to allow the permeated air o escape. Boston Green is colored and is known

by every newsboy in town. Hoston oper-ates in the Third ward, blacks shoes and "rushes the can" for the residents there. Boston was once taken by some of his colored friends to the banks of the murky Missouri. He was stripped to the garment nature gave bim and doused for an hour in the river, a rope being tied about his waist to prevent him from being drowned. That was six years ago, and he says he has not bathed since. Boston thinks it very unwholesome to expose the body in this way. When he is arrested it is usually for drunkenness or disturbing the peace, and his sentence will run all the way from fifteen to sixty days.

The most celebrated man in other ways the sixty days. than fifth is Jack Daily, or "the Mayor of Memphis," Jack has been in jail times without number. He is a harmless in-

dividual, lives by making speeches in saoons and on street corners and his only offense has been to violate the city's health laws. His hair the last time he was at the station was eight inches long and it was rumored that like the stars it might be inhabited, and the idea suggested itself that Jack should take a good wash. It would make him feel better and probably it would have an effect to reduce surplus population. Jack was entirely overcome. There was then nothing to take a bath in nor a comb to arouse the linkabitance of his hair. The police are now looking for Jack, and there is a premium for the one who persuades him to get in the new bath tub, plant his feet in the water, take a ber of soap and feet in the water, take a bar of soap and acrub himself till he resembles a white man once more. Jack, however, was not always a tramp. He once was quite a man in the world. He had some money and some influence, but he became the victim of drink at an early age in his business career, and it was not long before he was reduced to poverty and he has never since made an effort to rise above the level of the sigms. When he becomes intoxicated it has been the custom among hangers on about saloons and other places he frequents to paint him up in all sorts of fashions.
