In Spite of the Strike Trade Conditions for the Week Ha e Improved.

MILLS RUNNING ON FUTURE PROSPECTS

rextile Manufacturers Somewhat Embarrassed by the Near Approach of a New Tariff, the Effect of Which is Problematical.

NEW YORK, June 29 .- R. G. Dun & Co.'s

weekly review of trade will say tomorrow: The great strike of coal miners has ended at most points, but another threatens to interrupt business more seriously for a ime, though the number of hands engaged is comparatively small. Travel and traffic grand total, 553. are well nigh arrested on about twenty western roads already, and strikes are breatened on all roads which use Pullman cars. On the whole, other changes during the week have been for the better. Many manufacturing establishments which were stopped by want of fuel have resumed. The depletion of the treasury reserve has been checked by the voluntary deposits of gold by New York banks. Exports of gold have Imost ceased. Congress has made much progress toward final disposition of the

tariff question. Crop prospects are now bet-ter as the harvest draws nearer.

The resumption of work in mines and mills has made good progress, but the de-mand for products is at yet smaller and less urgent than was expected. Buyers ap-parently waited for lower prices of iron and steel products, which manufacturers are slow to give, in view of the increased cost of materials and production. After suspen-sion of half the working force for more than a month, it was expected that orders for products would be very large. Instead there is a general complaint of duliness and narrow demand, and prices of Bessemer pig and some finished forms are a little weaker. Although the working force has evidently ncreased, several establishments have stopped for want of orders or because no settlement regarding wages for the coming year has been yet reached, Textile manufacturers are embarrassed by

the near approach of a probable change in the tariff, the effect of which cannot yet be calculated. In spite of this reason for de-ferring orders and purchases, the number of mills quitting work is not yet as large as was expected, for there appears a little more demand from clothiers and jobbers. more demand from ciothiers and jobbers. The cleaning up process has been accelerated with success by concessions in some cotton goods, but all orders are still limited and the accumulation of goods continues. Somewhat better orders in woolens, particularly in low priced all wool goods and in clay diagonal and worsted cheviots, though not the contract of the process of larger trade. large in amount, give hope of larger trade. But the mills are buying cautiously, and sales of wool fell below last year's, 2.788,700 pounds for the week, against 3,142,900 pounds last year. In four weeks of June sales two years ago were 23,769,250 pounds, last year only 9,759,867 and this year 11,-37,824 pounds. Growers and other holder of wool seem disposed to demand higher prices than can now be paid, but receipts from the interior are liberal and exceed the present demand. Wheat has declined 2 cents.

HALF A YEAR'S RECORD.

Small Amount of Railroad Building So Far

in 1894. NEW YORK, June 29.-The Railway Gaette in its issue today says: Certainly noody has been looking for the present year to make much of a record as a year for railway building, and probably many will be surprised to learn that there has been more than a normal amount of new railroad building. Yet the new lines of track laid in 1894 up to July 1 shows an aggregate of 495 miles. This is the lowest half year's record that has been reported for years. The total is 539 miles below the new mileage built the first half of 1893, and only a third of the track built in the first half of 1891. An examination of the length of the new lines and the parts of the country through which they have been built makes it clearer why nearly 500 miles of road have been constructed under such unfavorable conditions. No state has built 100 miles of road. The total is fifty-four miles, in South Carolina

No Actual Pusiness Improvement but a Petter Feeling Among Merchants. NEW YORK, June 29 .- Bradstreet's will say tomorrow: While there is no actual and a better feeling among merchants, with an increased number of instances where trade has been-stimulated. The bituminous coal strike is promptly followed by a sym-pathetic strike of railroad employes, which threatens a disastrous effect on business by reason of interference with distribu-tion and travel. Losses on perishable freight in transit are already reported. There is an extremely restricted volume of business among wholesale dealers in clothing at Baltimore, 43 per cent of what it was in the first half of last year, and a sharp restriction in the volume of general trade at Chicago, where the railway strike centers. At New Orleans trade in all lines is smaller. At Portland it is dull and without a sign of early improvement. New England woolen mills at work on dress goods and men's wear report a moderate revival, and shoe

shipments from eastern factories hold up well, while Boston banks report an increased demand for loans. Exports of wheat (flour included as wheat) from both coasts equal 1.717,000 bushels, against 1.927,000 bushels last week, 3.971,-000 bushels in the last week of June, 1893, 3,216,000 bushels in that week of 1892 and

2,221,000 bushels in 1891. The total number of actual business failures in the United States in the past six months (failures in which assets are less than liabilities) is 6,528, which is more than in any preceding similar period, an increase of 4.6 per cent compared with the first half of 1893 and 22 per cent more than in the six months of 1892. The present tendency in the number of failures to decrease is shown by the fact that while at the end of the first quarter of the current year the increase over the like period last year was 900 failures, the increase this year over last at the end of a half year is only 289 failures. Total habilities of failing trades for the six months are \$82,555,600; assets being 54 per cent of that total. These aggregates are less than one-half of what they were for six months in 1893, and smaller than in the six months of 1891 as well. Pennayi-vania and California show striking increases in the number of fallures, and Illinois and Kansas noteworthy decreases.
