Heavy Receipts, Present and Anticipated, Weakened Wheat Yesterday.

MODERATE SPECULATIVE WHEAT TRADE

In Corn There Was a Fair Trade and Prices Changed Frequently Within a Brief Range—Stocks and Bonds.

CHICAGO, Aug. 29.—Heavy receipts, present and anticipated, weakened the wheat market today and December finished with a loss of 5c.

In what there was only a moderate speculative trade. The price kept within 3c range, with the trade practically all local.

The feeling was again weaker and a little lower. Initial trades were at 1/2 to 3/8 loss.

December opened at 56 1/2c and sold off from 56 to 55c, rallied 1/2c, became dull, changed some and closed with December at 56 1/2c.

The weaker tone was due mainly to the large movement in the northwest, the lower cables and heavy receipts were primary markets, all which combined to make the situation weak from the start, the price later on having a slight rally, influenced some by the upturn in corn and reported heavy exports, which were afterwards found to be an error.

There was a good deal of changing September to December at 3/4c difference, and a prominent local leveler concern was credited with doing the reverse.

In corn there was a fair trade and prices changed frequently within 1/2 to 3/4 range. The feeling was rather mixed, the price softening after the close, but the market was quiet free selling from the start and prices sagged back, being a continuation of yesterday's decline.

The selling of the start was influenced by the more favorable crop news, the weather reports being rather more bullish. The rally which followed was attributed to the prediction of the local leveler that the crop would be a feature was the liberal offerings within a fraction of 5/8c for May, but at that price a good demand prevailed and checked any further decline.

One contract was credited with selling 500,000 bu. May during the early part of the session. Outside markets were all easier and fractionally lower.

The market opened at 10 1/2c and sold off from 10 1/2 to 10c, rallied 1/2c, eased off 1/4c, advanced 1/2c, declined from 10 1/2 to 10c, changed some, ruled steady and closed at 10 1/2c for May.

Oats were active and fairly steady on good buying. There was free selling by the elevator people, but the demand was fair. The range for September was 5c. Provisions were generally firm on small hog receipts, firmer outside markets, good buying and rather scarce offerings.

The market weakened moderately near the close. Compared with last night, January pork and ribs are unchanged and lard is 1/2c higher.

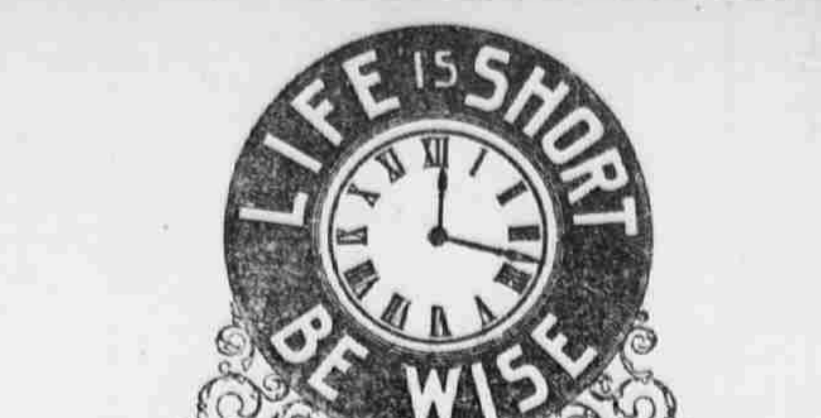
