Northern Pacific Service. Notice that the Q and C are Crossed in Track.

SHERIDAN, Wyo., Sept. 13.—(Special Telegram to The Bee.)—Word has been received from Billings that O. F. Goddard, the attorney for the Northern Pacific railroad, has advised notices on Kilpatrick Bros. & Collins, the Burlington contractors, forbidding them to cross the Northern Pacific track at Hamlet.
