only and all-sufficient creed for the whole Twenty years ago David Swing was dragged before the tribunals of the Presbyterian church, charged with heresy, of preaching false doctrine, dangerous to the spiritual life of the world. Last Sunday afternoon Rev. John Henry Barrows, pastor of the First Presbyterian church of this city, standing over all that remained on earth of the distinguished professor, and

"Prof. Swing will be remembered as a preacher of a new type. He stood before you luminous with a heavenly light, his features made lovely by his thought, discoursing of the life of man, the life of love, the divine Jesus, the blissful immortal-ity.' He did not preach like others, but according to the bent of his own genius. There was a quiet power which moved many minds as fiery exhortation or elaborate ex-egesis does not always move them. With ethical enthusiasm, with luminous intelligence, with gentle sympathy he made known his faith in God's goodness and man's possibilities. His intellectual refinement was extraordinary, and it seems almost an irony of fate that this rude city of the west should strange to millions that out of Chicago one year ago there blossomed the fairest flower of art the earth has ever seen.

Is it not the acme of retributive justice that these words were spoken by a representative member of the same church famsentative member of the same church fam-ily from which David Swing was driven with the cruel scourge of dogmatic theology a score of years ago? Malediction then, apotheosis now! Could there be a more complete exhibition of the utter folly and wickedness of the theological differences, the creedal disputations, the insistence upon rule and discipline that have so long kept the human family divided in relationships where complete harmony ought always to prevail?

To have "taught the people to love God and man" is a greater thing than adherence to the best scheme of degmatic theology ever invented by man—and it is well to remember that theology is as amenable to the frailties of human judgment as any other science. Dr. Barrows' tribute was but the new spirit of brotherhood, finding in that most fitting occasion an opportunity of exmost fitting occasion an opportunity of ex-pressing itself. It marks a higher state in the evolution of religion and emphasizes anew the sweet lesson of the dream of good Abou
