Minority Bondnolders Want a Quarter

Million of the Gould Wealth. JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Oct. 30.-The heriff of Miller county today served notice on George J. Gould, president of the Mis-souri Pacific railway, for appearance in the souri Pacific raitway, for appearance in the Miller county circuit court to plead to two separate suits instituted by the minority bondholders of the Springfield, Warsaw & Setaina Railroad company, aggregating about 2250,00. The railroad in question is now in the hands of a receiver. It is al-legged, among other things, that Mr. Gould was also cited to appear and show cause why he should not be fined \$100 per day from April 7, 189, for acting as an officer of the raid in question and an officer of the Missouri Pacific at the same time, in viola-tion of the constitution of the state, which prohibits an executive officer of one line of railway from holding a like position in the manuscement of a parallel or compet-ing line.
