WAYSIDE POEMS—By Wallace Bruce. Cloth, 165 pages. Harper & Bros., New York. From Mcgeath Stationery Company, Omaha.

Singularly intimate views of Scotch and Irish scenes, together with vivid narration and sincere and simple expression, promise enduring popularity for Mr. Bruce's work; and its international value has been well expressed by Principal Fairbairn, who said that the American poet had "wed the Hudson with the Tweed." The new and attractive edition of Henry Kingsley's "Havelock" has been completed by the addition of "Geoffrey Hamlyn" in two volumes. This makes five volumes of the two novels, the first being "Havelock" in two volumes, and the second "Geoffrey Hamlyn" in one. Henry Kingsley's works stand high among English fiction of the past generation, and he is considered by many critics as one of the greatest novelists of the 19th century. The new edition is pretty and convenient, the volumes being small and the paper being of a fine quality.
