FIELDS FOR WOMEN'S WORK

Practical Suggestions for the Protection and Preservation of Life.

PURE MILK AND WHOLESOME BREAD

The Lack of Both Strikingly Noticeable in Omaha-What the Mortality Records

Show-Unworked Field's for

intrude myself into the affairs of the gentler

ex, or even intimate that the woman of today is neither sufficiently occupied nor amused. There is, however, a constant growth in the direction of enlarging the scope of "Woman's work," and I trust I will not eem presumptuous if I venture to make a few suggestions in the nature of not simply enlarging the field of woman's work, but rather make it more beneficent and helpful. One of the results of the Centennial expedition at Philadelphia was the introduction of improved methols of bread-making, i. e., what is called the "Vienna" method. This method has resulted, during the past eighteen years, in an improved bread, which is now quite largely used and sold, more especially in the easiern cities. It is now regularly served at oriels and restaurants of good standing, and an be purchased in bread shops that cater to be better trade. Although so-called "Vienna read" is sold in Omaha, I do not believe that do any injustice when I state that I have not been able to purchase a first-class loaf of bread in Omaha, nor have I ever found any served at the hotels or restaurants in this city. Bread is plentiful, but is almost invariably poer, most of it unwholesome, soggy, or the reverse, too dry, difficult of digestion, owing wither to the presence of too much starch, or its not being sufficiently leavened.

Broad is the sufficiently leavened. Hread is the staff of life; it is the universal food; is used at every meal; in fact, that it is indispensable goes without saying. That Omaha's bread can be improved is a fact which cannot be controverted.

While the Vienna method may or may not e the best, still one thing is sure, there is vast opportunity for improvement in the read product of Omaha. Why not organize club in the interests of good bread? Se-ure from all quarters of the earth the best ecipe, and let every member of the club resent the results of her handlwork for rial. Publish the recipes in the daily press; nspect the bakeshops; insist upon good flour and only wholsome materials being used, and sceptic conditions being closely observed. such a club could work wonders, its object would command public approval, and there would be to the members that satisfaction which follows a work done for the public

Another field for woman's work is the improvement and regulation of Omaha's milk supply, notoriously bad, although perhaps not worse than that of other American cities, yet seemingly almost as bad as it can well be. Cow's milk, when freshly drawn, is absolutely sterile; even if subjected to no ontamination, it rapidly decomposes, and is soon the vehicle of countless millions of dangerous microbes. The subject of pure milk has caused more than usual interest during the past year by medical and food journals, the "Dietetic Gazette" being prominent in this respect, from which I quote:

The dangers that lurk in milk are no greater now that they are recognized and their re-sults measured than they were when their existence was not even suspected. The re-sponsibility for their continued existence is direct proportion to the knowledge we have ncerning them.
"For instance, there is scarcely room to doubt that milk which often contains the specific germs of typhoid fever, scarletina, cholera or diphtheria, which has been con-taminated from the sources of the animal furnishing the milk, and that such contami-nation could be avoided by the exercise of rdinary care on the part of the owners. ordinary care on the part of the owners, Indeed, infection could take place only through criminal neglect or equally criminal ignorance." Much has been done in New York in the improvement of the product as in keeping poor milk out of the market, While I resided in Essex county, New Jersey, there was to my knowledge only one dairy that served pure and wholesome milk. After I removed from the county there was a virulent epidemic of typhoid fever, the source

virulent epidemic of typhoid fever, the source of which was located in the contamination of the milk supply. Quite a number of deaths was the result thereof. Happily, radical legislation has removed this lamentable condition within the past two or three years. In order to secure pure milk the cows should, in the first place, be healthy, well-protected, cleanly and fed on bland food. Any food that contains strong odors or acids will affect the milk, and under no circum-stances should fermentive food, such as prewers' grains, be given, as neither boiling, nor alkalies, nor predigestion will overcome the toxic principle therein developed. From personal experience I have no doubt that the feeding of brewers' grain to mileh cowas has been the cause of death to thousands of infants from cholera infantum. The dairy and all utensels should be kept scrupulously clean and asceptic; the delivery of milk from open cans should be forbidden by law, which law should cause inspection and regu-lation of milk at places of production. In the household milk should invariably be kept in air-tight vessels, and never exposed kept in air-tight vessels, and never exposed to the atmosphere even for an hour. If fed to infants and children it should be sterilized, and possibly filtered, although this will not entirely destroy the toxic principle caused by the feeding of brewers grains or other causes. Pure milk from healthy cows fed on bland food, properly served and kept under asceptic conditions, and after being properly sterilized, is next to mother's milk (the infant's hirthright), the best food for infants, and it is also the the best food for infants, and it is also the ideal food for children, and where it is not relished or disagrees in ninety-five cases out of 100 it is not the fault of good milk.

Up to a year of age no child should use any food hut milk, or take any drink but pure water, except under the direction of an experienced physician. It would be still better were every child under 5 years of age to have pure milk as a large part of the direction of the control of the still better were every child under 5 years of age to have pure milk as a large part of its daily food. The deaths per annum from cholera infantum, in Omaha, have averaged eighty-five, for the past four years, or about 75 per cent of the mortality from consumption. Cholera infantum is recognized to be a dis-case of nutrition. While pure milk alone may not control this dreadful scourge of in-fantile life, still it will do much, and is well worth an effort on the part of motherly women. Where pure milk can be obtained and served to infants under asceptic conditions, together with cleanliness, sanitary and other proper conditions, the mortality by

holera infantum can be very materially re-In the city of New York Mr. Strauss has done a noble work in supplying depots from which pure sterilized milk can be obtained free on the recommendation of a physician by poor people. Possibly this may not be necessary in Omaha.

Summer will soon be on us, with its in-creased mortality. Cannot, will not women organize, to the end that the milk supply and methods of use be improved? What woman but whose motherly instincts are not touched by the poor, little wasted infant, slowly dying, because selfishness, venality, neglect and ignorance forbid it to live?

Here are indeed two fields for woman's work; better than music; better than art; better than society; yes, better than worshipping at the shrine of Trilby, and furthermore in keeping with the work of the Divine Master.
