Pleaded Guilty to the Murder of Catherina Ging and Sent to the Pen. MINNEAPOLIS, May 4.-Claus A. Blixt has pleaded guilty to the murder of Catherine Ging. He was sentenced to the penitentiary

for life. Although the trial was not expected to occur until May 14, the self-confessed murderer decided yesterday to plead guilty at once and let his atonement for the heartless killing of Catherine Ging begin. His attorney pointed out to him that if he stood trial the jury probably would not convict him of murder in the first degree, and that he would thus escape hanging, but Blixt preferred to confess and accept the mercy

of Judge Poul.
