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July Wheat Opened Higher Than Its Closing Price Yesterday—Sellers and Buyers Changed Their Coats Repeatedly.

CHICAGO, May 27.—Wheat was feverish with sudden and wide fluctuations, covering a range of from 2 1/2c above to 1 1/2c below the closing figures of Saturday, and closing 1 1/2c lower. Corn was weak throughout and lower.

The session commenced with the new daily market, which evoked excitement in the wheat pit. The bulls already held the whole of the grain in the visible supply and bought for future delivery all that will be harvested from the growing crop.

WHEAT GIVEN ANOTHER PUSH After a Preliminary Skirmish in New York. NEW YORK, May 27.—The country got another grind on wheat this morning, and during the first hour, after a preliminary skirmish with professional operators, during which prices advanced 1/8c, the market opened up to a point 2 1/2c above Saturday's closing.

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EXTERMINATING THE SALMON

Greed of the Cannery Liars to Ruin a Great Industry. Wholesale Ravages in Alaskan Rivers.

WASHINGTON, May 27.—The rapid inroads which fishing and packing companies have made upon the supply of salmon in the Alaskan rivers has given great concern to the government since it became evident that the fish were destined to the same fate of extermination which has overtaken the buffalo and is being inflicted upon the fur-bearing seals of the northern waters.

It has recently become the attention of Commissioner Lamoreux of the general land office that the salmon packers are acquiring much land at the mouths of rivers where they are engaged in prospecting strategic points of future commerce.
