CHICAGO, May 28.—Wheat was unsettled and nervous throughout the session, but closed bullish within 1/8 of the top here for the day and 2 1/2 higher than it left off the day before.

Wheat opened with an emphatic enunciation of its bullish principles. The generally prevailing price when the start was made was 85 1/2 for June, 84 1/2 for July and 84 1/2 for August.
