Wheat Went Up with a Whirl and Down with a Thud.

MANY FACTORS CONTRIBUTED LARGELY TO THE WEAK MARKET.

Market Turned Extremely Weak During the Last Hour Because Every One Tried to Sell at Once.

CHICAGO, Sept. 25.—Wheat went up with a whirl and down with a thud today, closing 1/2 cent lower for December. Shorts were scared by last night's bludge on the curb, but the advance tempted longs, who reeled out during the closing break. Many corn lots, May, also closed unchanged and provisions declined slightly.

Wheat showed decided strength most of the session, but soured at the finish. The bulls started on the curb yesterday afternoon on a dispatch from London, saying that Russia was now offering very little wheat, the current shipments being wheat sold some time ago for September and October shipment. A good deal of this strength was left over and affected the market at the opening and there were a good many orders from the outside, brought in by the news of the advance, which was not lost last night. The fact that the north-west deliveries were only about two-thirds of what they were yesterday and less than they were a year ago also tended to strengthen the market.
