CHICAGO, Oct. 9.—Wheat was weak at the start, but turned sharp around on good buying from the seaboard, closing higher. May corn advanced 1/2c and May oats 1/4c. Provisions started weak on the increasing hog receipts and lower prices at the yards, but reacted later by the strength in the market, closing slightly lower. January pork 1/2c higher, while other provisions were buying freely there, presumably on foreign orders. This quickly started the market, and prices early in the morning started to get back what they had disposed of, and there was good buying.
