SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

Will Be Brought for Trial in District Court This Morning.

SPECULATION AS TO LINE OF DEFENSE.

Hinted that He Will Try to Show that He Inherited the Shortage in the County Treasurer's Office.

SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

This morning the civil suit of the county against Adam Snyder, ex-county treasurer of Douglas county, will be called before Judge Ferguson.

SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

Yesterday the county attorney appeared in court and requested that no more cases be called, in order to give this case the right-of-way.

SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

Adam Snyder was county treasurer from January 1, 1890, to January 1, 1892. When he left the office and the newly elected officer entered it was discovered that there was an alleged discrepancy in Snyder's accounts of about \$6,377.

SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

It was found that there was a shortage of \$5,000 in the bond sinking fund and \$1,377 in the hospital fund. A suit was begun against Snyder and his bondsmen, who had signed a bond of \$250,000, to recover this amount, and at the same time criminal action was instituted against him, charging him with embezzlement.

SUIT AGAINST ADAM SNYDER.

The defense of Snyder, as shown so far, is two-fold. In the first place an attempt will be made to show that Snyder paid out the amounts which he is alleged to have embezzled. The second defense, which is on the part of the bondsmen, is that they cannot be held liable because the bonds were not properly issued.

A showing made that this alleged embezzlement was not an embezzlement, but a mistake in the figures on the books.

Another hint is that another and entirely different defense may be made. It is understood that this will consist of an attempt to show that Snyder was not the treasurer of the county at the time the money was short.
