Small boys have to endure much in this way from the hands of slightly older sisters proficient in matters of law and delighting to enforce the moralities. But sometimes the sisters lapse into naughtiness, and then the small boys

into naughtiness, and then the small boys have their chance. They, too, can on such occasions be priggish, if not downright hypocritical. A little boy has been quarrel-ing with his sister, named Muriel, just before going to bed. When he was undreased he knelt down to say his prayers, Muriel sit-ting near and listening.
