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HARD FIGHTING IN PROSPECT

The Task of Conquering the Sudanese Difficult if Not Hopeless.

VIEWS OF AN AFRICAN EXPLORER

Fighting Quality of the Derivishes Improved with Modern Weapons-Possibility of an Alliance with the Abyssinians.

William Astor Chanler, the youngest and most recent of African explorers, arrived in San Francisco recently.

He has been spending some weeks in Arizona and New Mexico, which proved to be not wholly devoid of interest.

He has been riding over the country, visiting his time to sport and adventure, and some days ago was afforded an opportunity for a rare bit of excitement in pursuing the renegade Apaches who murdered Alfred Hands, a rancher near Wilcox, A. T., two weeks ago.

Mr. Chanler is just now very much interested in African affairs, and says the San Francisco Chronicle. Though still a young man, he has spent three years of his life in travel and exploration in Africa, and in thinking seriously of equipping another expedition to penetrate into the unexplored parts of the interior.

Chanler is a son of the late John Winthrop Chanler, for many years a member of congress from New York. On his mother's side he is a grandson of William B. Astor. He inherited a large fortune, and after graduating from Harvard college he turned his attention to travel and pleasure.

In 1888, while only 21 years of age, he set out on a journey with many of his friends spending their time in clubs, watering places and pleasure resorts. He, with a small caravan of Zanabaria, a black man, who he called "the black" the first civilized man to make the complete circuit of Kilimanjaro. In 1892 he equipped another expedition which was said to be the most complete of any that ever visited the country.

He started for the interior after a June from Port Willand, on the east coast. Lieutenant von Hoehnel of the Austro-Hungarian army, who had previously traveled in Africa with Count Teuffel, of the German army. Mr. Chanler's servant, the only other white man in the expedition. He also took with him a pack of mules and a lot of baggage for the purposes of the expedition. The expedition was not so successful as anticipated, although the undertaking won much credit for the young American who organized it.

His own means. Chanler had many mishaps and discouragements. The donkeys taken along with him were killed by a lion. He had also procured sickened and died in the hot African climate. Natives were secured to take the place. These deserters, he also had to contend with. Then Lieutenant von Hoehnel was wounded by a rhinoceros and the young explorer was compelled to send back a part of his party to the coast. Chanler returned to New York in May, 1894, and has since written a book which he wishes to appear the latter part of this month. It is titled "The Jungle and Desert." Mr. Chanler says that for the maps and scientific information he consulted with the Austrian lieutenant, without, however, having gained the impression that they were very savage fellows. From what I could gather a very bitter feeling has existed among the Sudanese for the English and the French. It will make a very bitter fight against the English.
