CHICAGO, April 28.—The continued favorable weather in the spring wheat region had much to do with still further depressing wheat today, and July was under yesterday's closing price all day, finally closing at a decline of 1/8.

There was just a fair trade in wheat, the market ruling only moderately active, operations being chiefly local, with a few provisions and a few flour and a few... The feeling manifested early was a continuation of that displayed yesterday and still lower prices were secured.
