Bears Hammered the Market Down Over One Cent. CORN AND OATS WERE QUITE STEADY. Early Strength Was Attributed Largely to the Renewal of Crop Damage Reports—Stocks and Bonds.

CHICAGO, May 21.—The bears hammered the market down over today on reports of harvesting in Kansas. Corn and oats were comparatively steady, losing only 1/8c. Provisions were very weak, more especially lard. There was a very fair speculative business in wheat, the trade being chiefly local, and the lack of outside interest or support was the cause of the early break which followed the early advance.

On the produce exchange today the butter market was firm, receipts 11,000 lbs. daily, up 1/2c. Eggs, firm, receipts 1,000,000, steady, 70c. Cheese, steady, 70c.
