

CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Money Appropriated for Improving West Farnam and Cuming Streets.

PLANS FOR VIADUCT REPAIRS APPROVED

Payment of Claims of Firemen Who Were Laid Off Last Summer Referred to the Fire and Police Commission.

There was a special session of the city council yesterday afternoon which was chiefly remarkable for the spasm of street improvement that seized upon the members. It all started with Mercer, who submitted a resolution which provided that the Board of Public Works be directed to expend \$200 in placing Cuming street from Thirty-sixth to Fortieth in a suitable condition.

There was an extended controversy over a report of the finance committee in which a reference of the claims of the firemen who were laid off in July and August, 1894, to the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners was recommended.

It appears that C. C. Cochran, who is defending Manley, has been very anxious to get hold of the money and substitute a paper bond, alleging that the police authorities have no right to accept a cash bond.

Judge Scott Holds that the Article of the Libel suit of ex-Comptroller Theodore Olsen against the Bee Publishing company for \$25,000 damages was thrown out of court by Judge Scott yesterday morning on the ground that the articles complained of by Olsen were not libelous.

The matter came up on a demurrer filed by the publisher of the Bee, motion being made to dismiss the suit on the ground that the matter complained of was not libelous.

The article which Olsen complained was an editorial which appeared in the Evening Bee of December 12, 1895, under the caption, "A Groundless Complaint."

WITNESSES REFUSE TO COME

Iowa Railroad Officials Decline to Aid in the Claycomb Prosecution.

ORDERS TO EMPLOYEES COUNTERMANDED

Case Goes to the Jury with Practically the Same Evidence on Which the Defendant was Acquitted in a Previous Trial.

The hearing in the Claycomb grave robbery case was resumed yesterday morning and was submitted to the jury during the afternoon. Some mysterious but strong influence seemed to be at work in the case to prevent the prosecution from securing important evidence.

Last Saturday morning County Attorney Baldridge received a telegram from Division Superintendent Fox of the Rock Island at Des Moines, in reply to a message sent by Baldridge, in which Fox stated that he had ordered Messrs. Whyson and Griffen, baggage master and ticket agent at Council Bluffs, to come to Omaha yesterday.

When this feature of the case was reported to the county attorney his patience was exhausted and he denounced the proceeding in unmeasured terms.

Some of the officials who have been identified with the prosecution of Claycomb are at a loss to account for the actions of the railway officials, but one of them thinks a statement made by Claycomb not long ago throws some light on the matter.
