CHICAGO, May 26.—Free selling by discouraged holders of wheat, augmented by the large world's shipments, made another weak market today and July wheat finally closed 1/2 cent lower than the closing price yesterday. Corn and oats displayed the same drooping tendency and declined 1/4 cent. Provisions showed no indication of convalescence and made further declines.

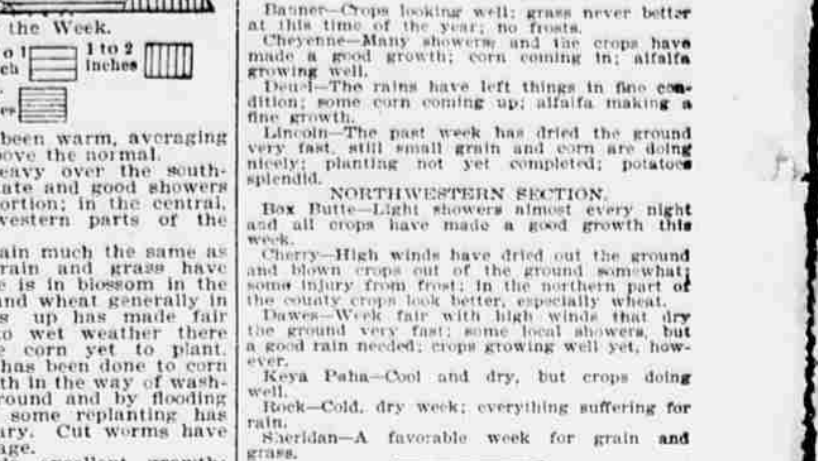
