Farther End Crop News an All-Important Factor.

IN WHEAT THERE IS MORE DOING

Buying Quite Urgent with the Trade. Broader Than for Weeks—Corn Trading Confined to Narrow Limits.

CHICAGO, June 5.—Farther end crop news was again an important factor in wheat today and caused an advance in July of 1/16 per bushel over yesterday's closing price. Corn and oats did not share in the bullishness, wheat being the only grain to show a gain. Provisions ruled firm and closed at a good advance.

In wheat there was more doing, the market being active and nervous. The range of the day was 1/16 per bushel. The opening was firm, the first sale being at 75 1/2 and improved to more before there was any material reaction. There was an unusual degree of activity and the buying was very urgent, with trade broader than for some weeks. Not only was there excited covering by local shorts but there was also active buying by local operators for the long account and commission houses had a fair line of outside buying orders. The early strength was due largely to the claims of damage to the crop of late, as indicated by the various state reports.
