

COMMITTEE ON OMAHA'S TRADE

No Great Activity Developed in the Local Jobbing District. COLLECTIONS ARE STILL NONE TOO GOOD.

Commission Merchants and Grocers Join Issue on Some Important Matters—Cut Flowers Have Been in Active Demand.

No greater activity has been noted in the jobbing district of this city during the past week and reports from representative houses indicate that, on the contrary, trade has been a little quiet.

A retail trade of the city as well as of the country has shown the effects of the rainy weather in a considerable decrease in sales as compared with the average for last month.

The differences existing between the retail grocers and the jobbers of fruit and produce are still unsettled.

George D. Kellogg of Newcastle, Cal., writes that by June 30 they will begin shipping car lots of peaches and pears to the coast.
