

YALES ARE GREAT FAVORITES

Physique and Good Manners Commanded by the British Press.

VARYING VIEWS ON THE SHORT STROKE

Members of the Crew Consider the Climate at Henley a Hindrance and Say They Never Feel Better Before.

LONDON, June 20.—The quiet, gentlemanly behavior of the Yale men at Henley and their splendid physique have created the most favorable impressions upon all who have seen them. They are already great favorites, and the comments of the press, generally, are of the fairest and kindest description.

The new college and Leander crews are working hard at Oxford. New College has a formidable eight of which J. J. DeKnopp of Alliance, N. Y., who was bow of the Oxford crew which defeated Cambridge in the historical race on the Thames this year, is a member.

Regarding our short, quick stroke, which the papers credit to me as a factor in our victory in the stroke employ in races in America, I found it necessary to give the men severe work, and therefore, I made them pull fast at first.

George Langford, the stroke in the Yale crew, is remarkable for his finding the climate enervating. I think it is braiding, I never felt better in my life, and with this Captain Treadway and Messrs. Baird and Rogers being on the boat.

"From my seat in the boat," said Captain Treadway, "I can judge the pace and it is far faster here than over American courses."

D. A. Wauchowicz, the stroke of the Trinity hall crew, said: "They are a strong crew and infinitely superior to the Cornell crew which helped to beat Cornell and I was much gratified in so doing, but these Yale men are a different class of rowers. They work in work and manner. Their stroke is handsome and even, but I should like to see a little more strength put into the finish and have a 'little deeper'."

Dr. McDowell, the American champion sculler, who arrived here yesterday, finds fault with the narrowness of the course. He has been used to much wider space and feels as though I shall run into the boats. I also feel that the wind blowing directly across the course will tend to prevent the boat from proper trim. However, sportsmanlike, I could take a defeat without regret. I think the Yale stroke is too short for his course.

Mayor Simmons of Henley claims that the Yale men have wonderfully improved within the last few years, and that the stroke is much longer than at first and on that account he hopes for the best, especially as the Americans are feeling well and are pleased with their course.

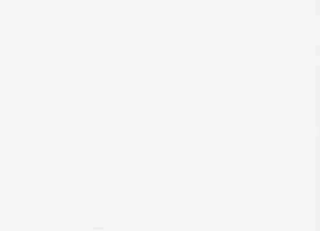
