Democrats Accused of Stealing a Gigantic Army of Voters.

POPULIST LEADERS ISSUE AN ADDRESS

Assert that Forty Thousand Votes in the Black Belt Were Lost for Goodwin and Counted for Johnston.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Aug. 5.—The populists are much wrought up over the result of the election in this state, and are openly charging that the most stupendous frauds were committed by the democrats.

"In the black belt counties the reports state that Dallas or some other black belt county will send up the usual majority, but we must have a majority in every county."

"The populists are very exasperated on account of wrongs practiced upon them and will not support the Bryan democratic electors. They will put out an electoral ticket of their own, and whatever majority may be taken down their ticket, vote that ticket, or see 100,000 votes practically lost."

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Aug. 5.—Further results from Monday's election show that Johnston and the democratic ticket have secured forty-one white counties and a populist, Pike, Cullman and Tallapoosa, are close and in doubt.

ATLANTA, Ga., Aug. 5.—(Special Telegram.)

Johnston's majority in the white counties is nearly 10,000, not including the black belt, which is calculated to dispose of the Georgia Populists, who have been counted out.
