All the Speculative Produce Markets Weak and Demoralized.

WAS A PRETTY GOOD TRADE IN WHEAT

September liquidation was, however, the feature, the fear of Liberal Deliveries the first being an argument.

CHICAGO, Aug. 12.—All the speculative produce markets were weak and demoralized with liquidation, particularly of near-by deliveries. Wheat for September closed at 57 1/2c, the lowest since 1891. Corn, provisions and oats closed lower.

There was a pretty good trade in wheat early, chiefly in the way of liquidation, after which the market became a little excited, the range for the day being from 57c to 58c. The tone developed was weak, and the market again sold off, September declining to 57 1/2c and 57c, and December to 58 1/2c and 58c.

Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 100,000; corn, 700,000; oats, 500,000; hogs, 100,000.
