PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

The following proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, as heretofore set forth in full, are submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, to be voted upon at the general election to be held Tuesday, November 3, A. D. 1896.

A joint resolution proposing to amend section two (2) of article five (5) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to number of judges of the supreme court and their term of office.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, that section two (2) of article five (5) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. The supreme court shall consist of five (5) judges, who shall be elected by the electors of the State of Nebraska, to hold office for a term of six (6) years, and their term of office shall be so fixed that one shall expire each year.

Section 3. That section four (4) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 3. At the first general election to be held in the year 1898, there shall be a court created by section four (4) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, to hold office for a term of six (6) years, and their term of office shall be so fixed that one shall expire each year.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to section six (6) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to compensation of supreme and district court judges.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, that section six (6) of article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 6. The judges of the supreme and district courts shall receive for their services such compensation as may be provided by law, but not to exceed the sum of three-thousand (\$3,000) dollars per annum.

A joint resolution proposing to amend section two (2) of article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to compensation of the officers of the executive department.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, that section two (2) of article seven (7) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. The officers of the executive department of the state government shall receive for their services such compensation as may be provided by law, but not to exceed the sum of five-thousand (\$5,000) dollars per annum.

A joint resolution proposing to amend section one (1) of article eight (8) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to the power of the legislature to create or abolish offices.

Be it resolved and enacted by the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, that section one (1) of article eight (8) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The legislature shall have the power to create or abolish any office, and to fix the duties and compensation of the same, but no office shall be created or abolished so as to take effect after the expiration of the term of the legislature which created or abolished the same.

A joint resolution proposing to amend section one (1) of article nine (9) of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska, relating to the power of the legislature to create or abolish offices.
