In Outlets the Early Market Was Quiet, but It Improved Later and the Aggregate Business Was Good.

CHICAGO, Sept. 19.—The late steady advance of wheat culminated today in a general rush for profits that December closed a shade lower in spite of conditions that ordinarily would have caused a substantial rise in price.

Wheat opened strong and again sold at 62 for December, but the market had progressed very far, or a full 1/2 above yesterday's close.

The strength of the market was chiefly because of higher quotations from Liverpool, Liverpool, New York wires that yesterday's called offers of wheat to the United Kingdom and continent were not generally accepted.

Another desirable view in the market was the Minneapolis and St. Paul receipts, which showed a 200,000 bushels compared with 1,100 cars a week ago and 1,170 cars on the corresponding week of last year.
