CHICAGO LIVE STOCK. Liberal Receipts of Cattle Cause a Sharp Decline. CHICAGO, Dec. 28.—Liberal receipts of cattle today caused a sharp decline and by the time sales were well started, prices were off from 10c to 20c, choice dry fed cattle suffering the most. Receipts of hogs were good but for the commonest to the best beef steers, with transactions largely at from \$4 to \$4.50, and it was difficult to dispose of many half fat steers, except at a loss.
