BREAKS TWO CENTS AT THE OPENING

Slight Rally Later, but the Close is Weak and Other Grains Also Close at a Decline- Provisions Higher.

CHICAGO, Jan. 8.—A break of 2 cents per bushel in the price of wheat in the first half hour of today's session so effectively squeezed the bull feeling out of the house...

It was noted, however, that the price of wheat today was a subsequent rally of 1/4, the market still exhibited signs of weakness at the close.

In wheat, opening Liverpool cables were great disappointment instead of showing a sympathetic advance with the rice here yesterday, prices even showed a slight decline.

The year 1907 begins with one clear advantage—the past year has swept out of the way a great number of unproductive concerns.

Commercial failures amounting to \$25,000,000, a little over 1/2 per cent of the total, but not counting those failures which were in the nature of "dry" failures.

The failure of brokerage and "other" commercial concerns averaged \$24,450 each, increasing 15 per cent from 1906.
