Wheat Rises and Falls with Small Range and Quiet Mark.

CLOSE IS JUST ONE-EIGHTH CENT DOWN

Dullness is Really the Only Cause of the Decline—Corn and Oats Barely Show a Change—Provisions Irregular.

CHICAGO, May 3.—The wheat pit today was almost as quiet as the traditional mill pond. The price rose and fell within a narrow range and wound up the day with a 1/8 cent loss.

Wheat was weak at the close of the day, but the dullness of trade militated against the price moving more than a few cents. The same listlessness was characteristic of the other markets.

Provisions were irregular, 2 1/2c higher to 1/2c lower. The market was quiet at the close of the day, but the dullness of trade militated against the price moving more than a few cents.
