

COMBINATION OF FARMERS TRADE

Business Looking Up in Year's All Sections of the West.
COUNTRY COLLECTIONS ARE SATISFACTORY
Jobbers and Manufacturers Hopeful as to Future Trade in Tributary Territory—Advance in Live Stock Makes Better Times.

Local trade conditions have not materially changed since a week ago, but such changes as have occurred are on the side of still further improvement. At first only a few business houses were able to note any change for the better, but as the process of recovery became still more advanced, others were able to feel the effects, and now it is a question if there is a single house doing business in Omaha that is not able to prove it by books.

One of the best results of the improvement in business is the increased number of laboring people who have been able during the past few months to find employment. Almost every manufacturer has put a few more people at work, and the number of names added to the payroll has been small for each firm. In the aggregate the number of laboring people is now about 100,000 more than it was a year ago.

Another straw which shows the direction of the wind is the fact that Omaha jobbers report their sales of fruit jars as larger than ever before. The price of jars is also better, and they are getting in better shape financially and feel that they can afford to buy fruit jars and put in a larger quantity.
