CHICAGO, June 29.—The recent activity in the July wheat trading was conspicuous in its absence today, and this absence of trading led many to believe the corner, if one had existed, would have been worked out by the July option closed at the decline. September, which was more active, closed a small fraction higher. Corn and provisions closed firm, at about unchanged prices, after recovering after declines. Oats were weak and lost 1/4c.

Wheat opened under the bearish influences of good crop weather, favorable reports of thrashing rates, increased estimate of the yield by Thomas, and indifferent foreign markets. July was offered for sale at from 67 1/2c to 68c, or 1/2c below the price at which it closed yesterday.

September wheat, which was more active, closed a small fraction higher. Corn and provisions closed firm, at about unchanged prices, after recovering after declines. Oats were weak and lost 1/4c.
