OFFICER GLOVER A WITNESS

Positively Identifies Two of the Kastners as Murderers of Tiedeman.

IS NOT SO SURE OF THE THIRD ONE.

Wounded Officer Is Wheeled Into the Court Room and Tells His Version of the Deplored Event.

Officer Glover was on the witness stand yesterday in the preliminary hearing of the Kastners, charged with the murder of Officer Dan Tiedeman. He picked out two of the defendants, Joseph and August, as two of the boys who shot him during the shooting. He was not so confident about the identity of Louis, but thought that he was the third man.
