

CHLORAL PRODUCES SLEEP

Drug Taken to Cure Insomnia Brings Death to Sufferer.

A. P. HALE FOUND DEAD AT HIS HOTEL

Insurance Solicitor from Iowa Dies in His Room from the Effect of Drugs Taken to Overcome Sleeplessness.

An overdose of chloral taken with the intention of producing sleep resulted in the death of A. P. Hale at the Delmonico hotel some time between the hours of 12 o'clock Monday night and 7 o'clock last evening.

Shortly after the hour stated last evening Proprietor Coates of the Delmonico went to Mr. Hale's room and on receiving no response to repeated knocking forced the door open and found him lying lifeless upon the bed.
