CHICAGO, Feb. 9.—After ruling strong until within fifteen minutes of the close wheat took a sudden and inglorious fall.

Unloading credited by some to Cuddy and Letter and by others to St. Louis bankers started the market down and resulted in a loss of 3/8 of a cent and a fraction besides, the market closing 1/16 cent lower.
