

TIPS FOR THE TEACHERS

Supintendent Jackson Gets Out a New Circular Letter.

HOW TO PREPARE EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Work for the Schools Show at the Exposition and How it is to Be Mounted and Shipped.

LINCOLN, April 4.—(Special.)—State Superintendent Jackson has issued a new circular letter to the teachers which contains instructions and suggestions as to the preparing of exhibits for the educational department of the exposition. The letter is as follows:

LINCOLN, April 1.—To Those Preparing Exhibits. You will be greatly pleased to learn that I have recently received a letter from the Board of Education which will enable me to make an extension of the time which will be necessary for the educational work to be shipped to Omaha until May 15.

In compliance with my request the state commission has designated room No. 1 in the beautiful Nebraska building as the Nebraska Educational Headquarters. This room is on the first floor in the northwest part of the building and affords a beautiful view of the exposition buildings, and is a cool, spacious room, twenty-four feet square.

It will save much correspondence if each school will send carefully the following suggestions:

1. Our exhibit is the "general or collective" exhibit, and is distinct from the "special or individual" exhibit.

2. The exhibit should be prepared by the principal of the school, and should be in the name of the school and county.

3. All exhibits should be securely packed in boxes and labeled with the tags which will be furnished in due time by us to the county superintendent in the case of the county exhibits.

4. Three mounted cardboard should be sent for each teacher represented, in order to have two to exhibit and one to replace any damaged work. In mounting cardboard leave at least one-half inch margin for mounting.

5. We will furnish mounting.

6. Those going to Omaha to assist in preparing the exhibit should not be there for this purpose before May 15 or 20. The necessary expenses will be supplied.

7. Exhibits will be placed without expense where it is not convenient for some one from the school to accompany them.

8. We have provided for each school of the state a "High and Arbor Day Manual," and the program outline for April 22. It is not arranged to make April 22 "Educational Day" for your school. In addition to your program arrange to exhibit the work that has been prepared for the Trans-Mississippi Exposition. You can make this a daily duty which will inspire your pupils and secure the hearty co-operation of the parents.

9. Let me urge that you seek to make the school room more cheery and inviting by suitable decorations.

GETTING READY FOR WAR.

Adjutant General Barry is back from Greeley county and is hard at work making preparations for the expected calling out of the national guard.

A number of officers of the guard who were seeking information as to the situation and making arrangements for a quick concentration of the guard at the call of the adjutant.

Most of the mail received by General Barry, and fully three-fourths of that received by the governor, is from persons desiring to enlist in the national guard.

APRIL SHOWERS IN NEBRASKA.

Rain Falls Quite Generally in the Antelope State.

CULBERTSON, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—It commenced raining at about 9:30 yesterday morning and a steady rain fell all day. The ground was thoroughly soaked.

LOUISVILLE, Neb., April 4.—Rain began falling here on noon yesterday and continued all night. The ground is now down indefinitely. Most farmers are through with their seeding.

ITHACA, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A cold, drizzling rain fell here yesterday afternoon and continued nearly all night. Considerable water fell. If it does not freeze this will be good for the small grain. Spring wheat is all sown and quite a few farmers have begun sowing oats.

WYMORE, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A cold rain fell here all day yesterday, the precipitation amounting to almost half an inch. The ground is thoroughly soaked and farmers state that conditions for good crops were never more favorable at this season of the year.

SEWARD, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A steady rain commenced falling yesterday afternoon and continued nearly all night. It will greatly help the winter wheat, one and a half inches being the total rainfall.

BLAIR, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A slow rain commenced falling here yesterday at 1 o'clock. Temperature this morning, 44 degrees; rainfall, .44 of an inch.

COLUMBIUS, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A cold, hard pelting rain set in here yesterday about 5 o'clock and continued for several hours. The soil was pretty well soaked. Nearly all of the seeding will be done here this week.

DUNCAN, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—A steady rain set in here yesterday afternoon and continued until 10 p. m. One inch of water fell with a southeast wind. Today is clear, a heavy northeast wind is blowing. Fall rye and wheat are looking fine. Spring wheat and oats are coming all right. Peas are getting ready to plant for corn. The spring outlook is first class.

EDGAR, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—Rain fell here yesterday nearly all day and most of the night. The amount of precipitation was something over two inches. The ground is now too wet for the farmers to do anything toward spring plowing and the pro-

pects are for a rather backward spring. Wheat never looked finer or more promising at this time of year than at present.

NEBRASKA, April 4.—(Special.)—Rain began falling here yesterday at 11 a. m. and continued steadily until after midnight. About four inches of water fell. The ground is thoroughly soaked and will soon be in prime condition.

GENEVA, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—Rain commenced falling yesterday afternoon and continued the rest of the day and night. The precipitation was about an inch and a half.

ST. PAUL, Neb., April 4.—(Special.)—This county was blessed with a fine rain yesterday afternoon and evening which will be of much benefit to vegetation. The precipitation at this station was .61.
