July Wheat Bears Are Stamped on the Chicago Exchange.

That option closes with a net gain. Early news favors the bear side of the market, but later reports of strength in Europe turn the tables the other way.

Chicago, April 27.—July wheat bears were stamped on change today. The option named made a steady advance, wiping out an early decline of 2 1/2c and closing with a net gain of 1/2c.

Everybody was on the selling side from the start on lower cables, favorable crop news and declines at the northwest. However, foreign markets recovered sharply, Antwerp receding in advance of 6c. Shorts rushed to cover and bid July up from 91 1/2c to 92c.

May wheat recovered most of a 5c decline, but closed with a net gain of 1/2c. Corn and oats recovered early declines and closed unchanged to 1/2c higher. Provisions ruled dull. Pork declined 5c, lard 2 1/2c and ribs steady.

The foreign wheat markets, which were controlling influences at the opening here today, showed a decline of irregularity. Liverpool quoted a decline of 1/2c, while Paris was 2 1/2c higher.

The extremely favorable crop bulletins had a bearish effect, as did also news of a decline in the northwest. Tending began at a decline of 1/2c on July wheat. For half an hour the market acted strong and rallied to yesterday's close, but at the close of the day it was again in a state of decline.
