IS A BOND ISSUE NECESSARY?

Mr. Henry W. Yates, Omaha's well known banker, disagrees with The Bee in its opposition to a national bond issue under pretense of war emergency.

From the bondholder's standpoint the position of Mr. Yates may commend itself. From the standpoint of the taxpayer citizen who has no interest in the perpetuation of a bonded debt it appears indefensible.

The assumption that the war with Spain may cost \$300,000,000 is mere guesswork. The cost of the war will depend upon its duration.

Estimating the addition to the army at 100,000 men, their monthly pay roll at \$25 per man would be \$4,000,000.

Competing the cost of ammunition and transportation on land and sea at \$100,000 a day, we add \$3,000,000 a month, making a grand total of \$10,000,000 per month.
