JULY AND SEPTEMBER SHOW A DECLINE

CHICAGO, May 26.—Despite Mr. Letter's efforts the wheat market broke away from him today as far as July, September and later futures were concerned. July shows a decline of 2 1/2c and September is off 2 1/2c. Corn is down 1 1/2c and oats 3-3/8c. Pork and ribs are 1/2c lower and lard 2c.
