The ear now advocates peace for the sake of humanity, believing that a peace combination of the great na-tions will be forcible enough to prevent great wars in the future and thus carry out America's polley of setting disputes out America's policy of settling disputes through arbitration instead of by the sword. There is no disguising the fact that European nations have been made to spen their eyes as to the effect of modern weaponr and the great skill and science displayed in our recent war with Spain, which has lessened confidence in their own war defenses There has been no record at all comparable with our two great asya, conflicts, which through up-to-date implements of war en-abled our well trained, skillful and brainy abled our well trained, scaling and brand officers and sailors to destroy the Spanish battleships, quite equal to our own as such, and an immense number of lives, with a loss of but one man on our side, thus show-ing that we protect the lives of our sailors while dealing death and destruction to cur enemy. This remarkable exhibition, when recorded in history for future generations, cannot fail to read like fiction. Its moral effect upon the great European nations is shown by the czar's action as the first out-come therefrom. Germany has felt strong heretofore in her triple alliance; Russia and France have felt equally so by their de-fensive and off-ensive connection. What will it all amount to in the event of an alliance between the United States and Great Bril-ain? In the event of a great naval con-flict with continental alliances on the one side, the English-speaking race would be very apt to combine, which if done would easily reduce to a peace footing all other heretofore in her triple alliance; Russia and reduce to a peace footing all other races and tongues.

## LONDON STOCK MARKET REVIEW.

Disarmament Proclamation Strength-

ens the Market at First. LONDON. Sept. 4.—Prices moved consider-ably last week, although the closing of the Btock exchange yesterday provents quota-tions of the change. The disarmainent pro-lamation of the Russian emperor strength lamintion of the Russian emperor strength-ened the market at first, but the irritation that followed it in Paris quickly checked the upward movement. This movement was still further retarded by the developments in the Dreyfus case.

On the other hand, the report of an Anglo-German agreement as to Deinger hay had a stimulating effect, especially in Portuse bonds, which closed 25-8 per cent higher.

Among railway securities Baltimore & Ohio shares rose 61/2 points. Central Pacific 3 points. Union Pacific from 3/4 to 11/4 points and Northern Pacific preferred 21/2 points. Northern Pacific common went 1 point lower and there was a decline in Atchison. To-peka & Santa Fe, Chicago, Milwankee & Paul, Louisville & Nashville and Nor & Western, due to the expectancy of a further reaction before a fresh advance






