Bohemians Celebrate the Day of Their Patron Saint.

FIRST CHRISTIAN KING OF BOHEMIA

Noted for His Pious Devotion to the People of His Kingdom—Work of Love Rewarded by Assassination and Canonization.

Delegates to the biennial meeting of the Bohemian Catholic Central union gave up their time yesterday for the celebration of the day of their patron saint, St. Wenceslaus.

The sermon for the occasion was delivered by Father Neuzil, who dwelt upon the virtues and Christian nobility of the saint, and urged upon his hearers to seek to emulate the example of him whose memory they were revering in these special services.

Sketch of the Saint. St. Wenceslaus, in whose honor the day is celebrated by Bohemians, was the first Christian king of that country. He was a devoutly religious man, devoted to his people, and giving much of his time to the care of the poor, the widows and the fatherless.

Wenceslaus was born in 902, and was the son of Wratislaus and Drahomira, and as his mother was not a religious woman, that part of his education was looked after by his grandmother, St. Ludmilla.

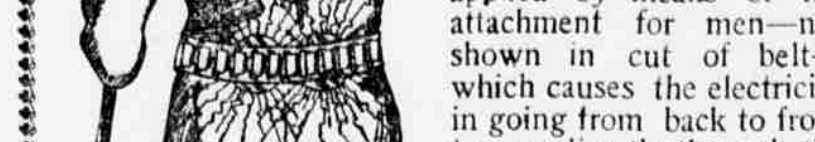

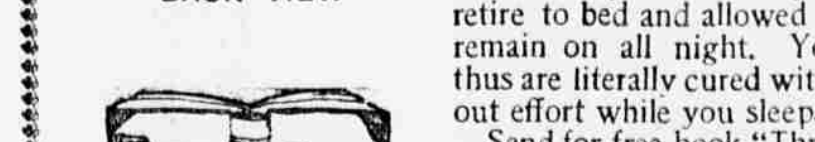
